
## Sequence for donning (putting on) and doffing (taking off) Personal Protective Equipment

To reduce the risk of transmission of infectious agents, personal protective equipment (PPE) must be used appropriately. The following tables outline sequences and procedures for donning (putting on) and doffing (removing) PPE. 
## Sequence for DONNING (putting on) PPE

Put on PPE before entering the person's room and before person contact.

## 1. PERFORM HAND HYGIENE



1. REMOVE GLOVES




Sequence for DOFFING (taking off) PPE

Eye protection and mask/respirator to be removed outside the room.


Begin PPE removal at person's doorway or in anteroom.

Outside surfaces of PPE are considered to be contaminated.

3. PUT ON MASK




3. REMOVE GOWN

5. PUT ON GLOVES




5. REMOVE EYE PROTECTION



6. PPE CHECK


