


ANTENATAL CARE

POPN is NALHN's online pregnancy platform that commenced in November 2021. Women who register a pregnancy with NALHN either by calling the Pregnancy Referral Line or from a GP's written referral, are sent a link to their phone to complete their medical, surgical history, and pregnancy details via the platform.

Midwives review the women's information on *POPN* before allocating their first pregnancy appointment which occur between 14-16weeks. *POPN* distributes antenatal education resources to the women throughout their pregnancy.

Once registered on *POPN* women are encouraged to book a double appointment with their GP to organise all early antenatal bloods and urine tests including first trimester screening. Most commonly first trimester screening includes a SAMSAS blood form and nuchal translucency ultrasound, however some women may choose to have a NIPT. All early antenatal results will be reviewed at the woman's first pregnancy appointment between 14-16 weeks. However, if you are concerned, Lyell McEwin's Early Pregnancy Unit is available for advice on 8282 1301, seven days a week.

NEW ALLIED HEALTH CLINIC OPENS IN ELIZABETH

A new UniSA Health Medical Elizabeth Clinic has opened and is located at 26a Mark Road Elizabeth South SA 5112 (1300 172 996).

They are operating several student-led Allied Health services including Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Exercise Physiology, Social Work, Podiatry, Speech Pathology, Psychology, Mental Health clinicians, and Nursing.

These clinics will be available at a low-cost option (approximately \$10 per visit) and fee reduction is available on a case-by-case basis. Patients also do not need to be an Australian resident, have travel insurance, or medicare cover.


