Priority	Inflammatory (ie, painful) otolaryngology/ Surgical referral
-	indicated if mass persists for four weeks without improvement
	Urgent referral if painless, progressive enlargement or if suspicion
	of metastatic carcinoma.
	Non-Inflammatory (ie, painless) – Otolaryngology referral is
	indicated in all cases of non- inflammatory neck masses
	Thyroid masses- Otolaryngology referral is indicated.

Pre-Referral	Inflammatory – Augmentin 20-40mg/kg/day

with referral)	Non- inflammatory-Trial of antibiotic therapy may be considered if
with cicital	an inflammatory mass is suspected. NB: 80% of all non thyroid masses are malignant.
Discharge	Once condition stabilises
