

(Residential Aged Care)

Direct Care Attendants provide direct client service to residents in aged care facilities. These roles work closely with other health professionals such as Nurses and Allied Health Professionals as part of a multi-disciplinary team.

Duties include:

- Bed making
- Assisting residents with bathing, showering personal hygiene and grooming
- Cleaning and tidying the resident's environment

Home Support Workers (Aged Care - Community/Disability Supports)

Home Support Workers provide a direct care service to clients in the residential home of the client. They provide services to persons who are aged, frail or disabled and wish to remain living in their own home with assistance. Clients have an active role in determining the shifts that are available, the duties that are performed and the frequency of demand for the service.

Duties include:

- · Cleaning of the client's home e.g. vacuuming, mopping, sweeping, wiping down of bathrooms, changing of bed linen
- Personal care, such as showering, bathing, toileting, personal hygiene and grooming
- Preparation and cooking of basic meals
- Providing social support including transport and shopping assistance, transport and social support

Leisure and Lifestyle roles can be found in Residential Aged Care Facilities and in the Community Setting. These roles develop social, group and individual activities suitable to the needs of clients.

Entry Pathways:

• For Home Care Support Workers or Direct Care Attendants a Certificate III in Individual Support or a willingness to work toward obtaining a Certificate III

Desired Skill Sets:

- · Ability to work well in a team environment
- Good interpersonal and communication skills, and the ability to relate to people from different cultures, backgrounds and circumstances
- Ability to prioritise work, meet deadlines and timeframes
- Ability to maintain confidentiality
- Flexible approach to work and rostering (including weekends/shift work)

These roles can be a pathway to Allied Health Assistant, Enrolled Nurse or Registered Nurse roles in the Aged Care Setting
