Country Health SA is funded by the State Government to provide mental health services in hospitals and in the community for people with serious and/or severe mental health conditions.

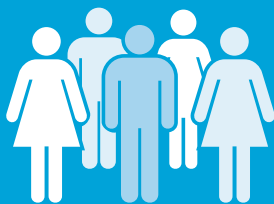
## TYPES OF SERVICES AVAILABLE



Acute inpatient mental health services, provided at the **Rural and Remote Mental Health Service** (based at Glenside Health Service Campus)

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**INPATIENT UNITS**  
(located at Whyalla, Berri and Mount Gambier)



Community mental health services, provided by 13 community mental health teams across country South Australia, including:

- > an Intensive Community Program at Whyalla, Mt Gambier and Murray Bridge
- > youth mental health services (for people aged 16-24)
- > older persons' mental health services (for people aged 65+)
