Investigations Required

Dysphagia

Oropharyngeal dysphagia

- May occur as a result of functional rather than mechanical aberrations of the swallowing mechanism
- Features suggestive of functional oropharyngeal dysphagia include:
- History of stroke/ neurological conditions
- Nasal regurgitation
- Coughing or choking after swallowing (suggests aspiration)

Oesophageal dysphagia

• Patient localisation of the level of dysphagia correlates poorly with the site of pathology

Information Required

- Red flag features
- Neurological deficits
- Episodes of food bolus obstruction

Red Flags

 Weight loss Progressive (rather than intermittent) dysphagia 	 Recurrent aspiration pneumonia Epigastric mass 	
Suggested GP Management	Clinical Resources
