From the Presiding Members



The above photo is the official photo of the MNHAC, taken in 2018. Since that time Trevor Laskey has retired and Joylene Tapscott has joined the Mid North Health Advisory Council.

The 2018/19 year has again seen the Mid North Health Advisory Council (MNHAC) focus on community needs projects.

At Booleroo Centre the long standing Doctor Simon Stilgoe resigned and relocated interstate to be closer to family. Successful recruitment has a new doctor commencing in July 2019.

At this time the community renovated and replaced the garden at one of the Doctors houses to accommodate the locum doctors in a friendlier environment.

At Jamestown the newly refurbished theatre suite was officially opened by Minister for Health and Wellbeing, the Hon Stephen Wade. The Mid North theatre suite, located in Jamestown, was dedicated and opened by Dr J W Shepherd. Dr Shepherd had a long history of providing surgical services in the Mid North and could be considered the creator of the surgical services provided from Jamestown today.

Orroroo Hospital celebrated its Centenary in April with a well-attended community celebration. Small communities highly value their health care services and Orroroo is no exception.

The provision of medical services was strengthened with Goyder's Line Medical Practice (Jamestown and Peterborough) providing GP services under contract for the last six months of the financial year. With a successful trial being completed, Goyder's Line will officially take over in July 2019.

Peterborough has seen much progress taken in the area of Aged Care. In February the Federal Aged Care Minister visited Nalya Lodge (aged care facility). At the end of April, Nalya Lodge was awarded 9 additional federal aged care bed licences. This will allow the relocation of Nalya Lodge to a new wing constructed under the main roof of the Peterborough Soldiers Memorial Hospital. Work has commenced on drafting plans for the new wing.

The MNHAC has also explored the acquisition of land adjacent to the Peterborough Soldiers Memorial Hospital from DPTI to allow access to a shared car park for both the Peterborough Community Garden and Peterborough Men's Shed, and also allow for a cost effective mains power connection for the Peterborough Men's shed.
