

Allied Health Professional is a collective term used for a range of disciples such as;

- Social Work
- Dietetics
- Speech Pathology
- Occupational Therapy
- Podiatry
- Orthotics and Prosthetics
- Physiotherapy
- Pharmacy
- Radiology/Sonography

Allied Health Professionals apply their skills to restore and gain optimal physical, sensory, psychological, cognitive, social and cultural functions of clients. Allied Health Professionals work across community and hospital settings across an individuals' life span from start of life to end of life. They work independently and together with other professionals to optimise the quality of life.

Qualification requirements:

 A University degree and for some disciplines, registration with the Australian Health Practitioner Registration Authority (AHPRA) is required to work as an Allied Health Professional Allied Health Assistants provide assistance and support to allied health teams and under the supervision of an Allied Health Professional.

Duties include:

- Assisting with patient preparation for therapy
- Assisting with patient movement or physical tasks as part of therapy intervention
- Administrative tasks related to the patient care

Entry Pathways:

Holding or working towards a Certificate III or IV in Allied Health Assistance.

Desired skill sets:

- Ability to work well independently and in a team environment
- Good interpersonal and communication skills, and the ability to relate to people from different cultures, backgrounds and circumstances
- Ability to prioritise work, meet deadlines and timeframes
- Ability to maintain confidentiality
- Flexible approach to work and rostering (including weekends)
