

Strategic Infrastructure Plan One of the key priorities is to Improve Public Transport



2008/09 State Budget -

 \$2 billion investment program to revitalise Adelaide's public transport network over 10 years



Public Transport Network Objectives

Improve Public Transport services (tram, rail and bus):

- More frequent
- Faster (better travel times)
- Better connected

 Make the best use of dedicated public transport corridors

Public Transport Network - rail

Major upgrade of lines -Concrete Resleepering

Electrification of Gawler line; Noarlunga line; Outer Harbor line

Conversion of rail vehicles from diesel to electric

50 new electric rail vehicles

Interchanges and Major Station Upgrades

Extended tramline beyond City West – supporting Bowden Village TOD

Accelerated Public Transport Network Program

2009/10 Australian Government Budget funding

Expanded State public transport package to \$2.6 billion

- New O-Bahn City Access project ease traffic congestion in the CBD
- Accelerated **Gawler** rail line upgrade to the north
- 5.5km **Seaford** rail line extension to the south, with additional new rolling stock (SAG 2009/10 Budget)
