Statistics Masterclass Series

AIM:

- To introduce concepts on measurement and statistics
- To showcase commonly utilised statistical concepts in health
- To provide strategies on utilising the best statistical approaches for allied health

OBJECTIVE:

Measurement is a critical part of health care service delivery. As health professionals, we routinely collect and report on data, which then informs health service policies and deliveries. So, how best can we use the data we collect and use statistics to demonstrate the value and impact of allied health? This training series will provide AHPs with the overview of data and statistics commonly used in allied health. It will also provide AHPs with a practical guide in undertaking statistics including commonly used statistical packages.

CONTENT:

What are different types of data? How can data be measured and reported? What are some theoretical and practical considerations for statistics in allied health? What are the different types of statistical tests commonly used in allied health? How do we interpret and report findings from statistical analyses?

FORMAT:

Online via zoom, combination of didactic presentation, individual activity and reflection/feedback to the wider group. The sessions will be recorded and sent out to all those who have registered upon conclusion.
