How to write an Abstract

Aims:

- To introduce the basics of writing a structured abstract
- To provide an overview of key concepts that underpin a scientifically sound abstract
- To showcase practical tips in developing a scientifically sound and consumable abstract for different audiences (journal, conference, report etc).

Objective:

Apparently, some people only read the abstracts of the research and never bother to read the full article. While this is not the case with SA Health Allied Health Professionals (AHP), abstracts do provide a “window” about the full article. This training series will provide AHPs with the knowledge and skills to frame a scientifically sound and consumable abstract.

Content:

Structure of a scientific abstract; Requirements of scientific abstract; Different abstracts for different consumers; When constructing abstracts – what to do and what not to do.

Format:

Online via zoom, combination of didactic presentation, individual activity and reflection/feedback to the wider group
