#### Asthma in adolescents and adults

- Defined as the presence of respiratory symptoms (e.g wheeze, breathlessness, cough and chest tightness), that vary over time AND
- Excessive variation in lung function (change in FEV1 of at least 200 mL and 12% from baseline, 10-15 minutes after administration of bronchodilator.

Recent hospitalisation or ED presentation

# **Red Flags**

#### Prompting consideration of other diagnosis

- D Change of voice
- 🔁 Focal wheeze
- ➢ History suggestive of aspiration
- Rapid deterioration of symptoms
- Recurrent ED presentations

Suggested GP Management	Clinical Resources
<ul> <li>Optimise inhaled medications</li> <li>Check inhaler technique</li> <li>Written asthma action plan</li> <li>Assess environmental allergens (e.g. pets)</li> <li>Look for other triggers- smoking, medications (NSAIDs, beta blockers)</li> <li>Appropriate control of allergic rhinitis</li> <li>Consider GERD</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>National Asthma Council Australia.
