
Demographics

- Ageing is a worldwide trend
- More than just baby boomers ageing
- Long-run decline in fertility and increased longevity

Ageing


- 40-year population projections have a high degree of uncertainty
- But much of the projected ageing is already "built in"
- Increased migration and fertility would not significantly impact on projected ageing


Age structure in SA



Health Costs rise with age


(\$ per person)





Fiscal Impact of Ageing


Annual budget balance per capita (real terms), relative to 2005-06






Ageing + rising health costs

A \$2.4 billion problem?


- 19.8% of revenue
- not acceptable
- debt
- future generations

Options?

- Tax
- Reallocation from other government services
- Reallocation from other health services
- Reduce impact through policies to deliver a healthier society

Household consumption per capita – real terms



Future deficit impact

A \$2.4 billion cut in spending would be equivalent to:

- 19.8% of total Government expenditure
- 27.8% of non-health expenditure

29 percent for 12 percent

- 12% of the population require public hospital services
- 29% of the Government's budget is for public hospitals
- Australia allocated 2.1% of its health budget in 2005 to public health and prevention vs OECD average of 3.1%

Health status

- Modelling assumes no deterioration in population's health
- Deterioration due to chronic disease could worsen fiscal impact

Health resources where?

- Illness vs wellness systems
- Acute vs primary care

Beyond Health

- Prevention better than cure
- Resources outside of Health
