The 2020/2021 year has proved to be difficult for everyone in the Health Service and yet our Flinders and Upper North Local Health Network have met the challenge.

Two new members of the community have joined our Health Advisory Council during this period. Bronwyn Millington, who is the Diversional Therapist at Flinders House and Eric Brown who has joined as a community representative, even though he is the CEO of the Flinders Ranges Council. His experience is welcomed.

The Health Advisory Council during this period has endeavoured to have open communication between the Community and the Health Service. During the year presentations have been made to various groups regarding the preferred method of communication. Our local Quorn Out and About Facebook page has proved to be very successful in keeping the community up to date.

Again, our area suffers from a General Practitioner shortage and our community is collectively working towards addressing this issue. Recruiting and retaining high quality staff is a challenge at the best of times but it has proved to be particularly difficult this year.
